



NARRAGANSETT TURKEY

The Narragansett turkey is named for Narragansett Bay in Rhode Island, where the variety was developed. The Narragansett color pattern makes them predominantly silver birds with golden tails and are one of the most beautiful of the Heritage turkey breeds. They are known for their calm disposition, good maternal abilities, early maturation, and excellent meat quality. The standard weight for young toms is 23 pounds and for young hens is 14 pounds.
