## SICILIAN BUTTERCUP

This exceedingly rare Sicilian breed derives its name from the combination of unique comb shape and the golden buff color of the hen's plumage that is similar to the buttercup flower. The flower-shaped comb is totally unique in the poultry world and its size makes the breed a poor choice for cold climates. "Buttercups," as they're called, are good layers of medium-size white eggs and are capable foragers. Also called "Flower-birds", this breed is a delightful addition to the backyard flock.
